



## Transition standards vwo 4 5

Assessment and reporting is based on four assessment criteria (0-8) in each subject. All assessment criteria are tested at least twice per school year. The summation of the results of the four assessment criteria is called the MYP SUM (which ranges from 0-32).

The minimum pass mark is 20 points. For subjects chosen by the student in vwo 5, an additional criterion requirement applies, usually a 5/8 for criterion A.

Within the transition standards count:

- All chosen subjects in the profile part and the free part in vwo 5 (with criterion requirement)
- All other subjects, including PHE and CA (without criterion requirement)

Deficiency points and compensation points are awarded as follows:

### Comments

- For a chosen subject, in addition to an overall score "good", you must also meet the criterion requirement to get the compensation point.
- If you are satisfactory in the overall score for a chosen subject, but do not meet the criterion requirement, this will result in a deficit point.
- Falling just short in a subject always results in a deficit point.
- A failing grade in any subject always results in a two deficit points.

## Core subjects scheme

Students should not have more than one deficit point in ne-and-wi.

### Promote

The student's file must be in order.

Students who have only one deficit point and otherwise only pass grades can be promoted without compensation.

Students with two or three deficit points can be promoted if they have one compensation point for each deficit point.

### Reject

Those with insufficient compensation points for two or three deficit points as well as those with more than three deficit points cannot be admitted to vwo 5.

The team meeting may decide on deferred promotion in the event that a student achieves the grade criterion but has not completed the practical component or has not yet handed in his/her work.

In this case, before the summer holidays, by a date set by the school, the pupil must have satisfactorily completed his units of study. If the pupil has completed his units, he is still promoted. If the work is not completed by the set date, the pupil is not promoted.

A student will be rejected in the following cases:

- If the above numerical criterion is not met
- If a student meets the numerical criterion but has not completed the action part fully or satisfactorily, even after a deferred promotion.

Doubling in two consecutive years of the same school type is not allowed.

### Exceptions

The team meeting reserves the right to place a pupil in the "discuss" category in exceptional cases, even if this is not in line with the above-mentioned limits. If the meeting decides to do so, the perspective question will be raised in two rounds:

- How is the perspective per subject?
- How is the perspective in the whole thing?

No rights can be derived from these exceptions.
